FY2022-23 Grant Award Methodology

New Diversion Program and TAIP Grant Requests

Regional (multi-CSCD) Mental Health, Substance Abuse and Sex Offender treatment services and specialized caseloads will be prioritized for potential new grant funding. In addition, CSCDs without DP funding will be prioritized for new grant funding.

Continued Diversion Program and TAIP Grant Requests

Total score and program outcomes, if applicable, for successful completions for each like type program will be determined. Total score is comprised of a program score and a financial score.

Program Score is determined by the following elements:

1. Prior action plans,
2. Completion of prior action plans, if applicable,
3. Prior funding reductions,
4. Successful completion rate compared to statewide benchmark for like type programs,
5. Actual program outputs compared to CSCD program activity submissions, and
6. Residential Outcome Study (CCFs only).

Financial Score is determined by the following elements:

1. Unit Cost,
2. Timely Submission of Quarterly Reports,
3. Proposed Overhead and Administrative Costs, and
4. Independent Audit Risk Analysis.

Each CSCD's total score will be compared to the average score and each program's successful completion percentage will be compared to its prior completion percentage. Additional considerations include department revocation rates and impact of COVID-19.
