Batterer Intervention and Prevention Program (BIPP) Grant Funding Methodology

New BIPP Grant Requests

Programs that are fully accredited, consistently report program information, have been non-profit status for five or more years, and/or located in unserved or underserved areas of the state will be prioritized for potential new grant funding.

Continued BIPP Grant Requests

Five scoring elements will be used to determine program funding. Each element's percentage of the total program score was determined in collaboration with the Texas Council on Family Violence (TCFV). The five scoring elements include:

1. Average of two most recent audit scores (40%),
2. Successful completion rate as compared to statewide average rate (10%),
3. Successful completion rate as compared to its prior completion rate (10%),
4. Program monthly data report accuracy and timeliness (30%),
5. Program quarterly financial report timeliness (10%).

Additional Considerations

In addition to the scoring elements outlined above, other considerations include program funding amount per participant served along with geographical location of the program and documented information from TCFV program audits.
